Ayyubid rule, a new beginning for Islamic Jerusalem after the Crusader domination, was the curtain raiser for the transformation that the city received under the Mamluks. This major work, edited by Robert Hillenbrand and Sylvia Auld, is the third volume in a series. Following *Mamluk Jerusalem* (1987) and *Ottoman Jerusalem* (2000), which were very much products of the former British School of Archaeology in Jerusalem, this final volume serves as a magnificent record of the art, architecture, archaeology and science of Ayyubid Jerusalem and the wider Islamic world.
